



Signal Person Safety Training Course for Cranes

Effective November 8, 2010, a new OSHA rule which replaces a standard from 1971, clarifies the specific requirements to be a qualified signal person. This training course will provide attendees with the essential information to comply with the new OSHA Signal Person Qualification requirements as specified within 1926.1428. The Signal Person Safety Training course for Cranes will discuss the four different types of signals used.

Attendees need to pass with an 80% or higher on the written and practical exam, in order to receive their card and certificate. The course is approximately 6 hours.

The course will discuss the following:

- Basic operation of crane equipment and it's limitations
- Dynamics of the crane
- An understanding of boom deflection
- Terms and definitions that apply to crane signaling
- Signaling when working near power lines
- Problems that may be encountered when signaling
- When is it required to have a signal person
- Who is allowed to signal a crane
- Basic signal types
- How are signals transmitted
- Qualifications of a signal person
- Written exam
- Practical exam



Who should attend?

Any construction personnel who could reasonably be expected to assist an operator. Also, anyone else that may be responsible for crane activities such as project managers, superintendents, foreman and safety managers.
